THE POSITION

The individual selected for this **part-time position** will have overall responsibility for supporting schools and administrators in the Clark County School District with the implementation of the District's anti-bullying pilot program in coordination with *Operation Respect* and *Welcoming Schools*.

RESPONSIBILITIES

1. Under the direction of The Public Education Foundation, act as a consultant to the Clark County School District to support implementation of its anti-bullying program.
2. Work in collaboration with the Clark County School District Equity and Diversity Department, the director of Welcoming Schools, the Director of Education of Operation Respect, and The Public Education Foundation.
3. Provide technical assistance and training to pilot schools in the district that want to implement an anti-bullying program based on Operation Respect and Welcoming Schools.
4. Assist UNLV professor conducting 3 year study of CCSD's anti-bullying initiative.
5. Work with CCSD, Welcoming Schools, and Operation Respect to develop a plan to expand CCSD's anti-bullying initiative after first year.
6. Assess the content of Welcoming Schools and Operation Respect to determine ways in which these programs could be tailored to Clark County and Southern Nevada by examining the programs' relevance to the area's diverse cultures and communities.
7. Work in collaboration with local organizations to create one or more Anti-Bullying & Diversity Community Forums (using the Welcoming Schools model), that would address key areas related to bullying prevention, family diversity and gender. For these forums, there will be a particular focus on reaching a diverse audience by working with partners from Latino, African American, and Asian communities.
8. Assist CCSD (either in developing courses and/or teaching the courses) in offering anti-bullying and diversity continuing education courses to CCSD teachers thru existing Equity & Diversity and Safe and Drug Free School trainings and by developing a stand-alone anti-bullying course.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

1. Experience in early childhood, elementary or secondary education
2. Experience conducting professional development for educators or other professionals who work with children
3. Knowledge of best practices in bullying prevention, school climate, equity and diversity, and LGBT inclusion in schools.
4. Bachelors degree and fluency in Spanish preferred
5. Transportation available to travel in Clark County and neighboring areas
6. Ability to work closely with multiple organizations, including the CCSD, Welcoming Schools and Operation Respect

LOCATION

This position will be located primarily in the Clark County School District, but may also involve other travel in Nevada. Although much of the work will include traveling to school sites, the specialist will be based in The Public Education Foundation offices.
